

# These Walls Can Talk

Mays-Brogan-Atkinson House  
3018 West Avenue, Austin, Texas

The story of this house begins with the land upon which it sits. A patent for this property was issued by the General Land Office on 1 September 1846 to Juliet Jaynes (Jayne.) This patent was for lot numbers 72, 74 and 75 in Division “D” of the Government Tract adjoining the City of Austin. Mrs. Jayne was the widow of Judge Brewster Helme Jayne who was killed by Indians in 1842 on or near this land. The family had come to Texas in 1840.

In 1903, Oakwood Addition, consisting of the parts of Out Lots 72 and 75 in Division ‘D’ that were located north of 30<sup>th</sup>, west of Oakwood Avenue and south of 32<sup>nd</sup> were annexed by the city of Austin. The Oakwood addition was slow to develop with most houses not being built until after 1915.

The front of the original house at what is now 3018 West Avenue was probably about 36 feet wide, with a 24 by 7 foot front porch and a was single story with an attic. The original roof was cedar shake. There were major additions, alterations, and repairs in 1914, 1933 and 1982.

The ceilings were twelve feet high and there were fireplaces in most rooms, according to a Brogan descendant who noted numerous chimneys in the roof line. There are still three old chimneys. Double doors led from the large front room to a room next to the parlor which was probably the dining room. There was a hall from the large front room to the back of the house and perhaps one to the south.

Lot number forty (40) of Oakwood Subdivision was purchased 16 June 1906 for two hundred seventy five dollars by “Mrs. Hannah B. Mays,

*means, the receipt of which is acknowledged.”*

Livingston M. Mays was married first to Rebecca Shinn on 24 September 1851 in Fayette County, Tennessee. She died 28 July 1854 of tuberculosis, apparently in Williamson County, Texas. He was married secondly to Rebecca’s sister, Hannah Brantingham Shinn on 29 November 1855 in Williamson County, Texas.

L. M. Mays was a merchant in Williamson and Travis Counties, Texas. The main business street in Round Rock was named for him. He and his partners had many businesses including a store, a quarry, and lumberyards. He was a leading citizen who was involved in civic development. The first telegraph in Round Rock was from the Mays and Black Store. He was postmaster at Old Round Rock, as was his daughter, Alice. His portrait hangs in the Williamson County Courthouse.

On 8 April 1910, L. M. Mays and Hannah B. Mays sold the property together with all improvements to their daughters; Alice Mays,

Patsie Mays and Ruth Mays for six hundred dollars (\$600.00). It was noted that the lot was "the same lot conveyed to the said Hannah B. Mays by The Austin Real Estate and Abstract Company...." (Vol. 256, pg. 162.)

After L. M. Mays death in 1914, the house was rented to Tecumseh H. Thompson, Chief Deputy U. S. Marshal for the Western District of Texas.

Senator Temple Harris McGregor was perhaps, briefly, the next tenant. It is unclear from the city directory and telephone books if Sen. Temple Harris McGregor lived at 3010 West Ave. in 1918. He is listed at the address along with Rev. R. W. Jopling in the street listings but at 3008 in the person listings. His residence in the telephone book is 3010 West Ave. from summer 1918 through 1931 when I stopped looking.

On the 1920 and 1930 censuses, he lived at 3008 West Avenue. He was born 12 May 1870 in Lebanon, Tennessee; the son of Andrew McGregor and Eudora Anderson. He married Nellie Herndon, a native of Missouri and they had two children; Douglas McGregor and Marietta McGregor Creel (Mrs. Wylie F. Creel.) Both children were successful attorneys and public servants as was their father.

Sen. McGregor was memorialized as a "distinguished elder statesman of Texas" upon his death 4 March 1953 in Austin. He served in the Texas State House 8 January 1907 through 12 January 1909 from Houston, Harris County, Texas. From 14 January 1913 through 28 May 1915, he served as State Senator from Austin, Travis County, Texas and from 13 January 1931 through 8 January 1935 in the House from Austin, Travis County, Texas.

In 1911, as a private citizen, he wrote the bill under which the Carlsbad Sanatorium was established and was extended all privileges of a

member of the House except the right to vote. Sen. McGregor was known as a gifted orator. His numerous contributions to the well being of Texas are included in attached materials.

Rev. Robert Ware Jopling, who was pastor of the University Presbyterian Church from November 1911 through March 1920, lived in the house from 1917-1920. Rev. Jopling was born 11 May 1865 in Virginia; the son of William Ware Jopling and Susan Elizabeth Claytor. He was on the 1910 census for Red Springs, Robeson County, North Carolina.

On 16 November 1915, he married Sue Hampton Tyler (daughter of Gov. James Hoge Tyler of Virginia and Sue Hammet.) Their daughter, Sue Tyler Jopling was born 4 November 1916 in Travis County, Texas. They also had a son, James Robert who was born 10 August 1918 and died 11 August 1920.

"High Points in the History of the University Presbyterian Church" states that "Mr. Jopling brought with him the traditions of Virginia and Carolina Presbyterianism. He was a careful student of Scripture and a dedicated minister." Under his leadership, students were brought into the church as deacons and leaders, "The church assumed support of East Austin colored Sunday School" and bought "property at 20th and West Ave for Mission Sunday School."

In 1930 Rev. Jopling and his family were living in Lancaster, Lancaster County, South Carolina where he was a clergyman in the Presbyterian Church. He died 8 June 1944 and is buried in the Tyler Plot of the Westview Cemetery in Radford, Virginia along with his wife, children and in-laws. Gov. Tyler's marker reads in part "...SOLDIER CHRISTIAN STATESMAN Holding all men as God's children and loving them without respect to race or creed, he was beloved likewise by all mankind. A devoted member of the Presbyterian Church for sixty

years, entrusted with many of its highest missions....”

The house was sold 4 October 1919 to T. R. Garth by W. L. Skinner, husband, Kate Skinner, Ruth Mays, Alice Mays and Patsy Mays (Book No. 315, pages 401-403 Deed of Records of Travis County, Texas) although Rev Jopling’s family remained in the house until 1920 with the Garths. On 18 October 1919, the mechanic’s lien for the addition and repairs was released by Mrs. Antoinette W. Cullen, widow of Edward F. Cullen. (Vol. 315, p. 396)

Thomas Russell Garth, Ph.D. was born 24 December 1872 in Paducah, Kentucky; the son of Robert and Jane Elizabeth Campbell Garth. Robert Garth was born in Scotland and was a bookkeeper. T. R. Garth married Ethel Nadine Tucker in 1909. Their children were Thomas Russell, Francis Marion and Ethel Nadine Garth.

“Who Was Who in America” Vol. I, 1897-1942, p. 442 gives information about Dr. Garth’s education and work. He received his B. A. (1909) and M. A. (1910) from the University of Denver. In 1917 he received his Ph.D. from Columbia University.

Dr. Garth was known for his study of the racial psychology of Native Americans. His work has been praised and damned but continues to be referenced. House & Garden Television referred to his work 16 August 2001 in “The Elements of Color.”

On 26 April 1923, T. R. Garth and wife, Ethel N. Garth sold the property to another University of Texas professor, A. P. Brogan (Vol. 352, p. 165). Albert Perley Brogan, Ph.D. was born 22 July 1889 in Omaha, Nebraska, the son of Francis Albert Brogan and Maude Haskell Perley Brogan. Of special note is the fact that he, his father and his two grandsons are listed in “Who’s Who in America.” Dr.

Brogan is also listed in “Texas Writers of Today” by Florence Elberta Barns. He was president of the Western Division of the American Philosophical Association in 1932 among many other accomplishments.

Francis Albert Brogan was born 6 December 1860 in Dewitt, Iowa; the son of Francis Brogan, a farmer, and Ann Cummins Brogan. Maude Haskell Perley was born 1 September 1869 in Emporia, Holt County, Nebraska; the daughter of Isaiah Edward Perley and Mary Jane Allen Perley.

Dr. Brogan received three degrees from Harvard University: A. B. in 1911; A. M. in 1912 and Ph. D. in 1914. He joined the faculty of the University of Texas in 1914 and served almost fifty years. He was instructor of Philosophy from 1914 to 1917; adjunct Professor from 1917 to 1923; Assistant professor from 1923 to 1925, professor since 1925 and assistant dean of the Graduate School from 1932 to 1936.

He was Dean of the Graduate School from 1936 to 1959. At the time of his death on 9 April 1983, he was Graduate Dean Emeritus and Professor of Philosophy Emeritus. “Apart from a visiting professorship at the University of Chicago in 1931, his entire professional career was at UT.” Dr. Brogan was a member of a number of professional associations and a writer of note. His son donated funds to support the Albert P. Brogan Reading Room at the University of Texas.

Dr. Brogan married Mary Cleo Rice on September 1916. She was born 18 January 1888 in Marlin, Falls County, Texas; the daughter of Benjamin Herbert Rice and Mary Bowles Carter. The Brogans had two children; Mary Rice Brogan, who was a veteran Texas reporter for the Houston Chronicle, and Francis Albert Brogan II. At the time of his death on 9 April 1983, he was survived by: son, Francis A. Brogan of San Antonio, grandson,

John Albert Brogan, great-grandchildren, Patricia and David Brogan, of San Antonio and grandson, Frank Cofer Brogan of Corpus Christi.

The grandsons spent the summers with their grandparents, the Brogans and the John Cofers, as their mother, Patricia Cofer, passed away when the boys were eight and five. Dr. Brogan's grandsons report that during the Depression their grandfather enclosed the screened porch and added a bedroom and bath.

On 16 May 1933, A. P. Brogan and Mary Cleo Brogan entered into a contract with Brydson Lumber Company to deliver "one additional room and one additional bathroom to the dwelling house....also to provide new floors in the entire enlarged dwelling house, with the exception of the kitchen, change certain partitions to the present building and make other various repairs and alterations to said present building...." (Vol. 448, pages 178-181) This is further confirmed by comparing the 1922 and 1935 Sanborn Maps. The Brogans employed the noted Austin landscape architect, C. Coatsworth Pinkney to draw plans for the front and 31st Street side yards. Mrs. Brogan grew roses in the back yard.

Francis Brogan was a ham radio operator and had his station in the out building which had a garage and one room. While in high school, he operated an AM radio repair business with customers driving down the alley and passing their radios through a window in the rear of the building. He told his children about being forced to go to dancing classes at the Penn House because there were not enough boys.

During Dr. Brogan's visiting professorship at the University of Chicago in 1931, James Clay Dolley, Ph. D. lived in the house. Dr. Dolley was born 29 September 1900 in Lebanon, Illinois. He earned a B. A. in 1919 from

McKendree College in Illinois. He received his M. A. from the University of Illinois and his Ph. D. from the University of California in 1928 and he joined the staff of the University of Texas in 1928 as an assistant professor of business administration. Dr. Dolley was associate professor of banking and investments from 1929 to 1935.

In 1935 he was made full professor and in 1945 he became vice-president of the University until September 1952 when he became acting President of the University of Texas. He held this position until January 1953. On 1 February 1953, he became president of The Austin National Bank but rejoined the University as system vice chancellor for fiscal affairs from 1955 to 1966. In 1966 he returned to full time teaching at the University because at age 65, he was no longer eligible to hold an administrative post under University regulations. Dr. Dolley died 28 July 1977 in Austin. Dr. Dolley is listed in "Who's Who in America," 38th edition and other lists of outstanding persons.

James Clay Dolley married Lois Dee on 5 July 1921. Lois Dee Dolley was born about 1901 in Illinois. She was the daughter of James G. Dee, a Methodist Episcopal Minister and Fannie M. Dee. The Dolleys had one daughter, Norma Dolley Kennedy. Mrs. Dolley was very active in social and service organizations. She died 10 April 1988 in Austin.

Dr. Brogan, through his son as agent and attorney in fact, sold the house to Dr. Simon David Atkinson, Ph. D. Associate Dean, University of Texas and wife, Penelope Atkinson. ("Vendor's lien retained in a Deed dated March 5, 1982, recorded in Volume 7702, Page 134, Deed Records of Travis County, Texas and a Deed of Trust of even date therewith recorded in Volume 7702, Page 137, Deed of Trust Records of Travis County, Texas") The new owner reported that Dr.



Brogan had so many books that the foundation was affected. His extensive library was donated to Baylor University by the family.

Information from the School of Architecture-The University of Texas at Austin online reveals that Dr. Atkinson received his “Dipl., Architecture from the Leeds School of Architecture and Planning in 1965; his Dipl., Planning and Design, Architectural Association in 1966; M. A. Urban and Regional Studied, Sussex (England), 1970 and Ph. D. University of Sheffield, 1989.”

Dr. Atkinson is “Director, Post Professional Program; Director, Graduate Program in Urban Design; Professor and Mike Hogg Centennial Professor in Community and Regional Planning.” In addition to his duties at the University, Dr. Atkinson is an international urban consultant and is active in many organizations.

Dr. Atkinson essentially opened the interior of the house and enhanced the roof line with a post modern tower; making this one of the most interesting and surprising houses in the area. The variously pitched roof line with its postmodern tower is eye pleasing and unique.

It is a surprising house when explored. One expects the usual older house but finds a “court yard” room beyond the very traditional front rooms. This area effectively separates various personal living spaces and provides a spacious common area with open kitchen. It is functional but fun, with large columns instead of walls. The house itself is entertaining and provides a wonderful place to enjoy friends.

The biggest surprise and most child pleasing aspect is the open area above, which is reached by a wide stair way that narrows as it leads to a landing which redirects the stairs westward and up to the second level. A cat walk crosses the open space to a loft with the open tower

area above. This upper living area is rustic/modern with bare wood and use of hog wire fences along stairs, cat walk and as barrier in loft. Sky lights provide natural light .There is a traditional attic area above the front rooms also reached from the landing.

The front of the house is Traditional/Southern while the rear has a Western/Spanish feeling. This intentional juxtaposition is clearly defined by the use of stucco in the tower. It has an arch entry with three styles of windows above; a different one at each level. When the old garage was being replaced it was evident that the rear would actually be a handsome facade.



Penelope Anne Atkinson received the property in a divorce settlement 19 June 1987. On 12 January 1996, Penelope Anne Atkinson sold the property to Roger H. D. Lacy and his wife, Anemone Dekker.

Roger H. D. Lacy and Anemone Dekker sold the property to Steven Curtis Crow, M. D. and his wife, Lindsey Crow on 9 June 1989. (Deed Volume 13213, page 02075). In July 2004, a replacement building for the garage and storage room was completed as the old building could not be renovated due to its deteriorated condition.

# 1872 Austin City Directory, R. L. Polk Company, Surnames J-N

---

A complete Directory of Austin is herewith offered to the public. Our city has grown so extensive-the population so great, such a work has become almost indispensable. The incomplete efforts to compile a Directory, made by strangers, men not identified with Austin nor her interests, have somewhat served to impede us in our labor. Nevertheless, having undertaken the enterprise, the publishers determined to push it through to a successful issue; and we are gratified at the support that been extended to us by the thoughtful and considerate portion of the community.

... The city has been thoroughly canvassed-every home within the corporate limits has been visited, and every effort made to get the name, residence and occupation of the head of families and citizens generally. In spite, however, of all the precautions taken, a few errors and omissions, doubtless, have occurred. Through the inexplicable motive of some who refuse to give the required information, the perversity of others who intentionally or innocently mislead the canvassers, and the difficulty of spelling proper names as pronounced by some of our foreign born citizens, it cannot be wondered at if an occasional error or omission is detected.

... It was the intention of the publishers to have given a complete and full census of

Austin, ...The Directory contains about fourteen hundred names, and as six inhabitants for every single name is considered a low estimate, it can be assumed that the total population of Austin amounts to about 8,500.

*[The 1870 population of Austin was 4,428. "City Population History, 1850-2000." Texas Almanac, 2002-2003- AGS Editor]*

It must not be forgotten, however, that this estimate does not include our large colored population, for, as a general thing, it has been found impossible to number them or fix their habitations. In many instances a single room or shanty is made to contain ten or more of them, large and small; and as they do not abide in any location for any great length of time, we have generally omitted the names of all except those who have a local habitation and occupation.

... We have endeavored to impress upon our citizens the necessity of informing us of any change they might make in location after our canvassers had visited them, but have not been materially assisted in this particular; if an error, therefore, should be discovered from failure to notify us of any change we disclaim all blame in the matter.

In the miscellaneous portions of the work, the Municipal, County and State officer have been published in such form as will be found quite useful for reference.

# Ezekeil Thomas PHILLIPS

---

Ezekeil Thomas PHILLIPS was born 28 March 1830 in Hall County, Georgia. He died 09 March 1915 in Travis, Falls County, Texas. He was the son of Robert PHILLIPS (1801 South Carolina - 1877 Georgia) and Mesene (Messina A.) HENDERSON (born 1825 Hall County, Georgia); Mesene was the daughter of Robert HENDERSON and Abigail RATCHFORD.

Ezekeil married Louise Jane "Lucy" WADE on 10 May 1854 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi, daughter of John WADE and Emily BANKS.

Ezekeil and Lucy are buried at the Phillips Cemetery in Falls County, Texas.

Ezekeil was called "E.T." or "Judge" by most who knew him because he was once a Justice of the Peace in Falls County, Texas. E.T. had lived with his parents on their farm in Georgia until he was 22 years old. He went to Pontotoc County, Mississippi in 1852 and worked as a foreman on a large plantation for 4 years. He farmed on his own there until 1869, when he moved to central Texas, locating in Falls County near the community of Travis.

E.T. volunteered for service at the beginning of the Civil War, joining Company G in 1861. After 60 days the group reorganized and he was assigned to duty in Company E, 2nd Regiment Mississippi State Cavalry. On 18 February 1863, 3rd Sgt. E.T. PHILLIPS re-enlisted at Ellistown for a period of 12 months. This enlistment was extended for a period of 2 years on 10 February 1864 by T.J. HARRIS at Bigby Fork. It was during this enlistment period that, on 16 April

1864, he was promoted to the rank of 2nd Lieutenant and received a bounty. His physical characteristics were listed as: age 35, height 6 feet one inch, grey eyes, light brown hair, and fair complexion. His occupation was given as farmer.

On 5 May 1864, he mustered into the Confederate States Service at Tupelo, Mississippi by Capt. Warwick HOUGH. His new term was for the duration of the war and his name appeared on the Roster of Officers of that organization. When the news of the surrender reached him, he was in western Tennessee.

The E.T. PHILLIPS family was among the many that came to Falls County, Texas after the Civil War. He was diligent in his work and good management enabled him to bring \$1500 to Texas. With this savings, he purchased 750 acres of fine land in the H.F. STERNS Survey in Falls County. This purchase included some land he later distributed among family members. His acreage was fenced by cross timbers, held together by saplings. Cotton was the principle crop and his pasture lands were stocked with cattle. Their first home was built of logs with a fireplace and it was finished as best as possible. Even though they had several former slaves to help, the family members had to learn to do things for themselves, but they had the stamina to do it.

In 1874, E.T. built a new house where he and Lucy lived in until their deaths.

The greater part of E.T.'s education was obtained by self-improvement. He was a

great reader and kept informed of local and national events. One of his treasured possessions was a large metal box which held copies of the Bible, Pilgrims Progress, and such documents as The Bill of Rights, the U.S. Constitution, and the Declaration of Independence. The grandchildren have vivid memories of how, on certain days and occasions, he required everyone, regardless of their age, to come to the front porch and listen to the readings and engage in the study of the contents of the metal box.

Politically he was an independent. He was a Master Mason, and a member of the Rosebud, Falls County, Texas Lodge. He and his family attended the Methodist Episcopal Church South. He was a respected person for his leadership in the community in which he lived 39 years, an example of the resourceful pioneer spirit of the settlers of Texas.

The Phillips Cemetery near Travis, Falls County, Texas began when E.T. and Lucy buried their oldest son, Robert Morris PHILLIPS, on their farm. Robert "Bob" was the Deputy Sheriff in Falls County and was engaged to be married at the time of his death. Accident or not, Robert was shot and killed by his deputy while he was getting ready to attend church. The deputy later married the woman that Robert was engaged to at the time of his death. Bob was a talented young man and at the time of his death he was expected to be a candidate in the next election for a seat in Congress.

Bob's parents buried him on the land he was to receive as a wedding gift. His grave is marked with a black iron fence surrounding it. So many local people requested and were buried at this spot that E.T. donated 2 acres for the public cemetery and formally executed the deed dated 24 Sept. 1903. The cemetery is located along US Highway 77

between Travis and Lott, Texas, and is now managed by the Phillips Cemetery Association in Falls County.

- 1) Susan A. PHILLIPS was born in March 1855 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi and died after June 1900, probably in Falls County, Texas. Family says she is buried at Phillips Cemetery but no record has been located for her burial there. Susan married George HALE.  
  
They had seven children: Teresa, Willie, Charley, Janey, Susie, Robert H. and Edward HALE.
- 2) Baby PHILLIPS died young in Pontotoc County, Mississippi.
- 3) Robert Morris PHILLIPS was born 17 January 1857 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. He died from gunshot wounds on 18 March 1883 on the family farm in Travis, Falls County, Texas.
- 4) John W. PHILLIPS was born 20 Feb 1862 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. He died 8 June 1935 and is buried in Phillips Cemetery, in Falls County, Texas. John was a twin to sister Leannah.

- 5) Leannah PHILLIPS was born 20 Feb 1862 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. She died 7 Nov 1936 on a farm near Travis, Falls County, Texas. Leannah married John Andrew GLASS in 1881 in Travis, Falls County, Texas. He was the son of Ebenezer GLASS and Rebecca Beavers PRATT. Three Phillips sisters married three Glass brothers. Leannah and Andrew married first. There are many triple first cousins born to these Glass-Phillips couples.

The children of Leannah and John Andrew GLASS were: Hugh Drayton GLASS, Sr. (who married Emma GRAUL), Judge Robinson GLASS, Andrew Lee GLASS, Mary Jane "May" GLASS, Robert William "Rob" GLASS, Louella Bevas GLASS, Morris Edward GLASS, Anna Irene GLASS, Minnie Ruth GLASS, and Lois Helen GLASS.

- 6) Willie PHILLIPS was born in 1864 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. Willie was a teacher.
- 7) Parks PHILLIPS was born 15 Sept 1866 in Macon, Pontotoc County, Mississippi and died 21 Nov 1902 on a farm near Travis, Falls County, Texas. She married Thomas Walter GLASS, son of Ebenezer GLASS and Rebecca Beavers PRATT.

Their children were Winton O., Nina Bird, Alma, Walter, Winona, Florrie, Orlean Beava, Gladys, and Mildred GLASS.

Miss Nina Bird GLASS never married and was a well known and honored school teacher and principal in Waco, Texas.

Orlean Beava GLASS married Cameron Milton KAY, well-known attorney. Their

daughter, Nina Winona KAY (1931-2007) was an educator. See attached obit below.

- 8) Georgia Mae PHILLIPS was born 8 April 1869 in Pontotoc County, Mississippi and died 26 Feb 1952 in Austin, Travis County, Texas. She married Felix Drayton GLASS Sr., son of Ebenezer GLASS and Rebecca Beavers PRATT. Their children were Justa, Wilma, Cue Dorothy, Felix Drayton "Bud" Jr., Sybil, William "Bill", and Virginia Lorraine GLASS.

Justa Bevas GLASS married the well-known attorney, James Henderson BENEFIELD, Sr. He specialized in oil and gas investments.

Felix Drayton GLASS, Jr. married Josephine STEEN.

Sybil GLASS married famous architect Hugo Franz KUEHNE. Kuehne was the founding dean of the University of Texas School of Architecture in Austin. He designed Austin's Central Library, completed in 1933, located at the corner of 9th street and Guadalupe Streets. This Kuehne building now serves as home to the Austin History Center. He also designed the Ritz Theater in Austin. Opened in 1929, it was specifically for talkies. The Ritz was originally a long narrow space, and was segregated like most movie theaters in Texas and other southern states at the time; there was a separate entrance leading to a balcony reserved for people of color. The theater showed primarily first-run westerns with a lower ticket price than any other theatre in town. It frequently brought in stars like Wild Bill Elliott and Dub Taylor, along with country music acts who performed before the movies.

9) Emma Elizabeth PHILLIPS was born 10 June 1872 in Travis, Falls County, Texas and died 16 March 1945 in Marlin, Falls County, Texas. She married Edward Von RAY on 15 Dec 1892 in Texas. Their children were Henry, John Edward, Janie, Gertrude and Minnie Louise RAY.

10) Minnie B. PHILLIPS was born 9 July 1875 in Travis, Falls County, Texas and died 2 March 1912 in Travis, Falls County, Texas. She married Albert B. HEMPHILL in 1893 in Texas. Their children were Herbert G., Son who died young, Millie L., Albert M., Louise, and Phillip HEMPHILL.

Note: Beavas is a family name. It was originally Beavers, the last name of an ancestor. But these southern folks said the name with such a strong southern accent that through the generations (for whatever reason) it changed from Beavers to Beavas.

The following is the obituary for Nina Winona KAY. Her name is pronounced 'Neena.'

*NINA WINONA KAY passed away in Marlin, TX on Tuesday, March 27, 2007. Born in Houston TX in 1931, she was the daughter of the late Cameron Milton Kay,*

*well-known attorney, and Orlean Phillips Glass, member of a large Central Texas family. Nina's love for education led her to follow in the footsteps of her aunt for whom she was named, Nina Bird Glass, an honored educator to several generations in Waco. Nina's own career in education had many honors, as she earned her Doctorate in Anthropology from Southern Methodist University, with a dissertation study of the Diet of Urban Native Americans. Dr. Nina W. Kay was a friend and mentor to many, as she served as their touchstone in matters of life, learning, and career. Nina was a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, served on the Falls County TX Historical Commission and the Falls County TX Appraisal Review Board, and was a graduate of the Leadership Texas program, a statewide organization for women. She is survived by son Cameron Milton Kay, of Cedar Springs, and daughter Christina Eckhoff and husband Mel, and two grand-daughters Melissa and Charlotte Vanderhoof of Austin, her sisters, Camille Kay Bogle, of Florida, and Linda Kay Andrews, of Houston, many loving nieces, nephews, great-nieces, and great-nephews; as well as her rescue weimaraner Samantha. She will be interred at the family cemetery, Phillips Cemetery, designated a Texas Historic Landmark.*

# Newspaper Notes

---

*Kay Dunlap Boyd*

One of my favorite things is to sit and page through a microfilm roll of old newspaper. No matter the age of the paper, something can always be found from scanning these pages. Editions might contain current events, gossip, advertizing, legal notices, ship arrivals, business cards, or obituaries. Of course, we are usually looking for information on our ancestors, but newspapers that are more current are fun to read. The more recent copies report events we lived through but have forgotten. These are extractions from some of my favorite or most informative newspaper findings.

*Dec 4, 1847, Vera Cruz Flores*

Mr. George Noessel has removed his Daguerreotype establishment from the Palace to number 686 Vicaro Street and as it is a family residence he hopes that the Ladies of Vera Cruz, who felt a delicacy in going to the palace, will now honor him with a call. Mr. Noessel will remain in the city only a few days. Vera Cruz, Nov 22, 1847

*Nov 5, 1859, The Rancho, Corpus Christi*  
W.P. Dunlap & Co. A large supply of lumber and shingles kept constantly on hand & for sale at lowest possible rates. Lumberyard at upper wharf.

*Dec 10, 1859, The Rancho, Corpus Christi*  
W. P. Dunlap received 90,000 sq. ft. of lumber on schooner UNION. Largest assortment of lumber, ceiling, floor and inch board available at W.N. Staples. Lumber arrived by schooner and already pre-sold.

*Sep 1, 1860, The Rancho, Corpus Christi*  
We announce the wedding of W.P. Dunlap and Nannie Appling of Guadalupe county being married at the residence of the bride's father.

*Jan 13, 1861, The Rancho, Corpus Christi*  
New Store and New Goods at Laredo, Texas. W.P. Dunlap begs leave to call attention to the city of Laredo and surrounding county

to his new stock of Goods direct from New York. My stock embraces all the nicest and richest styles of Ladies' Dress Goods, Silks, Gingham, Organdies, Lawns, Bareges, Brillents, etc. For Men and Boys Wear the best assortment ever offered of Prints, Dennims, Linens, Drills, Cottanades and a variety of ready-made clothing, Boots, shoes, Hats and caps, Hardware, Queenware, Choice family grocery provisions of every kind, Powder full assortment of everything. Will receive in exchange stock, wool, hides and cash.

*Jan 7, 1863, Corpus Christi Rancho*

I offer a good and valuable Horse Ranch for sale containing 500 acres of land, sitting on the Oso 8 miles south of Corpus. A good dwelling house with 4 rooms, gallery in front and piazza in back part, kitchen, carriage house, stable and negro houses complete. Three good plank corrals, garden and 10 acres under fence together with a number one cistern and 2 tanks enclosed holding water for 6 months. Titles good. Anyone wishing to purchase this kind of rancho will do well to give me a call. W.P. Dunlap.

*Jan 18, 1863, The Rancho, Corpus Christi*

W. P. Dunlap, horse brand, Rancho on Oso creek midway between Britton's and Bee's ranches, 8 miles south of Corpus.

*Jul 10, 1875, Bastrop Advertiser*

We regret to record the death of Mrs. Mary Miley, wife of Rev. A. B. Miley, which occurred in Bastrop, on the 27th ult. Mrs. Miley was a native of South Carolina, and emigrated with her husband to Texas, in 1867, and was 53 years of age at the time of her death. She a consistent member of the Primitive Baptist Church, a good neighbor, and excellent wife and a most affectionate mother.

*Dec 18, 1875, Bastrop Advertiser*

MARRIED -- At the residence of the bride's father in Bastrop on Monday evening, 4 Dec 1875, by the Rev. Mr. Baker, Mr. James P. Jeffrey and Miss Francis N (U) Miley.

*Nov 20, 1879, The Comanche Chief*

Those persons residing in the neighborhood of Mr. J.V. Carter are building a church and school house 16x28 feet. We are always pleased to see such improvements going on.

*Feb 5, 1892, Corpus Christi newspaper*

Mr. Eugene Noessel left Wednesday morning for San Diego to be present at the funeral of his uncle, Mr. Glover.

*Feb 19, 1892, Corpus Christi newspaper*

Brief bio of Rufus Glover. Son of D. B. and Mary E. Glover. Born April 28, 1855, near Palo Alto, Clay, Mississippi. "penniless orphan waif dependent upon a few kind-hearted relatives for advice and support." Apprenticed to Wm. Maltby and learned printing. Elected three terms as District and County Clerk, Duval Co. January 31, 1892, was waylaid and ambushed by Garza's men while acting as a deputy U.S. Marshall and scout to Company D, U. S. troop of cavalry, George F. Chase captain. Left a wife and child and a brother.

*Mar 29, 1892, Bastrop Advertiser*

Drowned in the Colorado River, at the Nash Ford, Tuesday Evening, Thomas Perkins, Aged 21 years. Deceased was an orphan boy, son of Frank Perkins, deceased. His parents died when he was quite young. He was a nephew of W. J. Miley of the drug firm of Miley and Hill. He was engaged in riding the mail from Webberville to Bastrop, making the round trip three times a week. On the evening of the sad accident he was returning from Bastrop to Webberville, and finding the river swollen, he attempted to ford it, when his horse gave out and both rider and horse drowned. His body was found about 200 yards from where he sank, to rise no more. His body was brought to Bastrop Thursday evening and interred in Fairview Cemetery just as the sun was sinking beneath the western horizon.

*Jul 30, ~~xxxx~~, Lockhart Post Register*

Mr. J. P. Dunlap passed though the city this morning on his way to visit his brother Mr. W. P. Dunlap in Luling. While here he visited the Post and exhibited his "honorable discharge" which was handed him 40 years ago.

*May 23, 1902, Luling Signal*

When the rain first began a miniature cyclone formed west of town, whirled down Railroad avenue to the S.P. depot, crossed the street and demolished Joe Dunlap's ice wagon.

*Aug 13, 1903, Austin Statesman*

A.J. Sjoberg, an old resident of Manor, died at the home of his son-in-law, Mr. C. A. Johnson at 2:35 o'clock yesterday morning. He was born in Sweden on the 30th day of December 1826 and emigrated to Texas in 1869, locating on the Eppright farm. The interment took place in the Manor cemetery at 4 p.m. yesterday.

*Dec 3, 1903, Lockhart Weekly Post*

Mr. William P. Dunlap passed through this city Saturday from Luling when he was called to the death bed of his brother John. Mr. Dunlap did not reach Adalia before his brother died.

Mr. John Dunlap, a highly respected citizen and former resident of Adalia died at this home near that place early Sunday at an advanced age. Mr. Dunlap had been a citizen of this country for a number of years, was a Confederate soldier and a citizen of sterling worth of character.....

*Feb 16, 1905, Lockhart Weekly Post*

Luling, Feb 13, Mrs. Sallie Staples, age 72 years, died at the home of her brother William P. Dunlap in the city Sunday morning. The deceased had been in feeble health for several years. Her remains were shipped to Corpus Christi for interment.

*Jan 16, 1908, Lockhart Post*

Sunday evening at the residence of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Jeffrey, were married Mr. T. G. Dunlap and Miss Mary Jeffrey. Rev. A. A. Culpepper officiating. Mr. Dunlap is one of the most substantial farmers of the Lytton community where he was reared. Miss Jeffrey is a favorite of her community.

*Nov 18, 1909, Panolina (Mississippi)*

Thomas W. Felker was born Jan 29, 1838 and died Nov 16, 1909 at the age of 71. He died at home on Oxford Rd.

*Aug 10, 1911, Lockhart Post*

Mrs. E. P. Dunlap, nee Eliza P. Felker, was born in South Carolina May 23, 1842, and moved to Mississippi when quite young. She was married to J. P. Dunlap, deceased, Sep 1857, and came to Texas in 1858, settling near Corpus Christi; then moved to Luling in 1865 and in 1886 moved near Lytton Springs and resided there until about one

year ago when she went to West Texas to visit her daughters. After only a few days illness she died Saturday, July 29th at 4:55 p.m. in Rule, Texas. Mrs. Dunlap was a member of the Primitive church. Survivors...

*Dec 14, 1911, Lockhart Post Register*

John R. Raney was born at Manor, Travis County, Texas on January 21, 1860. He was married in young manhood to Miss Annie Hornsby who was called hence by death. Afterwards he was married to Miss Mary E. Thrasher who with three sons survive him.

*Jan 23, 1913, Austin American Statesman*

John S. Boyd died at his home in Hyde Park last evening at 2:30 o'clock. He was born Nov 20, 1871 and died Jan 22, 1913.

*Aug 16, 1913, Austin Statesman*

Miss Bleuford Sanders and Paul Miller were drowned last night at Deep Eddy. Among the persons who were in bathing with the party were several excellent swimmers and if they had known their friends needed help or had heard their cries they would have rendered assistance at once.

*May 20, 1916, Austin American Statesman*

George Wilson Boyd, 18 years old, the son of a widow, Mrs. Louise Boyd, worked in his mother's grocery store and in a large part ran the business. Andrew J. Sibley was a stenographer. Both are dead as a result of the overturning of a boat Sunday afternoon on Lake Austin at the mouth of Little Bee Creek. Boyd could not swim. Sibley was a fairly good swimmer. Sibley got nearly to the shore and then turned back to save Boyd, both young men downing. Rescuers tried to resuscitate Boyd but he was quite dead.

*Apr 7, 1921, Lockhart Post Register*

Mrs. J. P. Jeffrey, formerly Miss Francis Ursula Miley, was born Jan 12, 1855 in Covington County, Alabama. She came to

Texas in 1866 and settled in Bastrop. In 1875 she was married to J. P. Jeffrey of McMahan who survives her. They resided at McMahan ever since their marriage. She had been an invalid for more than twenty years.

*Apr 10, 1927, Lockhart Post-Register*

Three days after celebrating his 86th anniversary of his birth, J. P. Jeffrey, one of Caldwell County's most prominent citizens died at his home at McMahan. J. P. Jeffrey was born in Tipper (Tippah) County, Mississippi, in 1843 and came to Texas with his parents in 1852 and located in Caldwell County and has resided here all that time. He was a valiant soldier of the Confederacy. The Confederate Monument in the courthouse yard was draped as mark of respect.

*Mar 25, 1931, College Star, San Marcos*

Thomas Dunlap, vice president of the Freshman class during the spring term, was elected president of the Sophomore class during the summer term. Dunlap is from Lockhart and has been a member of the Class of '33 since the fall of '29 when he entered college.

*Mar 6, 1932, Dallas News*

Back in 1902, Emil Seeliger, a Lockhart blacksmith and mechanic was dreaming of the horseless carriages which were appearing on the street in the East. So he at once set about drawing the plans and gathering the materials for the making of the automobile that would rate him as a pathfinder in the garage business in Lockhart.

*Nov 1936, Lockhart Post-Register*

A loaded shotgun which James P. Jeffrey of McMahan was carrying in his truck Sunday

afternoon fell out as he opened the door, was discharged, the load striking Mr. Jeffrey in the right foot, tearing away the great toe and a portion of the bone of the arch.

*Jul 6, 1939, Lockhart Post-Register*

Miss Adeline Stromberg was married at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. P. Stromberg, at Mendoza last Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. to Thomas J. Dunlap of Lockhart.

*1946, Lockhart Post Register*

Captain Woodrow Dunlap has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal. His citation follows: Captain Woodrow J. Dunlap, 924 Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 10 November 1944 to 5 May 1945 in Belgium and Germany.

*Nov 20, 1947, Lockhart Post Register*

Thomas Green Dunlap, a son of John and Eliza Felka (Felker) Dunlap was born February 27, 1868 in the state of Mississippi (Texas) but removed with his parents to the Lytton Springs Community of Caldwell County where he grew to manhood. His home was hospitable and his greatest pleasure in the last years of his life was welcoming old friends who came to his house.

*Aug 13, 1952, Lockhart Post Register*

Mrs. Mary Dunlap, 74, member of a pioneer Caldwell County family, died Saturday in the hospital after a long illness. She was the daughter of J. P. Jeffrey and born and reared in the McMahan Community. The Jeffrey and the Dunlap families have resided in Caldwell County for many years.
