Pamela BOYER SAYRE, Certified Genealogist and Certified Genealogical Lecturer, is director of education and publications for the National Genealogical Society and vice president of the APG National Capital Area chapter. She is coauthor of Online Roots: How to Discover Your Family's History and Heritage with the Power of the Internet (Nashville, Tenn.: Rutledge Hill Press, 2003) and Research in Missouri (Washington, D.C.: NGS, 1999, 2007). She penned the FGS FORUM's Digitools column for five years and is past editor of the Association of Professional Genealogists Quarterly. Pam is coordinator of Samford IGHR's Techniques and Technology course, and she has taught in IGHR's Advanced Military courses. She has spoken at genealogy conferences and seminars in twenty-nine states.

Pam is an honorary life member of St. Louis Genealogical Society and a former board member of both the Federation of Genealogical Societies and the National Genealogical Society. She holds a Bachelor of University Studies with emphasis in English, Sociology, and History from Eastern New Mexico University, and completed some course work toward a Masters in Computer Information Systems at Bentley College, Waltham, Massachusetts. She is a life member of the honorary society, Phi Kappa Phi. In her life before genealogy, Pam was a software documentation specialist and trainer, a personnel administrator, and a police detective.

Richard G. SAYRE, Certified Genealogist, is a longtime researcher, lecturer and writer. His areas of interest include urban research

methodology, mapping tools for genealogists, military records, immigration, the Ohio River Valley, and Western Pennsylvania. Rick has given presentations to a variety of genealogical societies relating to the above areas of interest, and he contributes articles to a variety of genealogical publications. Rick has lectured at Samford's IGHR in the Advanced Methodology, Advanced Military, and Land courses, and is the coordinator of the Mapping course.



Condolences are extended to the family of **Clarence Faag NIEBUHR** who was born on October 1, 1914, in Brenham, Texas, to Arthur and Karen Faag NEIBUHR. He died in Austin, Texas on March 25, 2009. Mr. NEIBUHR graduated from the University of Texas at Austin in 1936; and worked for many years as a CPA in various positions of state government, and retired in 1976. Clarence and his wife Althea were active in genealogical research and were active members of both the local and state genealogical societies. He was president of the state society. *Mr. NIEBUHR served as president of the Austin Genealogical Society in 1979 and 1980.*

Condolences are also extended to the family of **Dorman WINFREY**, a longtime state librarian, historian, and author, who died Saturday, March 28, 2009, after a long illness. He was 84. Dr. WINFREY was appointed director of the Texas State Library and Archives Commission in 1962 and served in that position until he retired in 1986. He worked as the state archivist at the Texas State Library and as an archivist at UT before he became director of the Library and Archives Commission. *Dr. WINFREY was a charter member of the Austin Genealogical Society.*

And our condolences are sent to the family of **William (Bill) M. KOEHLER** who passed away on April 3, 2009. He was born on July 8, 1925, to William Frank KOEHLER and Julia HRNCIR KOEHLER of Moravia, Texas. Bill graduated from Texas A&M after returning from World War II and began his career as a chemical engineer. He traveled the world over while working for Humble Oil (now Exxon-Mobil). After retiring to Austin in 1985, Bill and his wife Ruth enjoyed many years of hobbies, including travel, astronomy, and genealogy. Bill joined the Austin Genealogical Society and for many years, was Editor of the AGS Quarterly. In 1992, he and Ruth published a book entitled *Henry Christian Hardt, a Genealogy: 1639-1992* on Ruth's paternal grandfather who came to the Republic of Texas with his father at the age of eighteen. The book was awarded a prize by the Texas State Genealogical Society.
